THE PLAYERS Stadium Course at TPC Sawgrass was constructed with a very particular goal: build a course from the ground up with the spectators in mind.

Former PGA TOUR Commissioner Deane Beman is credited with introducing this "stadium golf" concept, and with the help of TPC Sawgrass course architect Pete Dye, the two constructed a course that is widely recognized—and admired—by millions of people worldwide.

The Stadium Course was built to be the first true "stadium course" and designed to enhance the spectator experience from every spot on the course. Large, sloping mounds were built to give fans unobstructed views of play, much like being in a stadium.

Beman's unique concept, along with Dye's expertise, is the reason why TPC Sawgrass exists and people travel from around the globe to take on the purest test in golf.

The Stadium Course became the permanent home of THE PLAYERS Championship—the PGA TOUR's flagship event—in 1982, but it was also built to be one of the few courses open to the public and playable by anyone.

Many fans know TPC Sawgrass because of its famous 17th hole. The Stadium Course's penultimate hole features an island green that is one of the most photographed holes in all of golf.

The 141-yard par-3 17th hole is not a long hole by any means. However, add in the water surrounding the hole, and the tee shot gives even the world's best golfers a nerve-racking, bucket-list defining moment. For a hole so famous, it is hard to believe that the 'island green' concept was not part of the Stadium Course's original design plans.

During course construction, Dye realized he had created a dilemma. Having mined so much sand from around the 17th hole to use it elsewhere on the course in order to help build the stadium's "seating," he was stumped. Where would the green go? Alice, Dye's wife, suggested, "Well, you've taken all the sand out, so make a lake and just leave the green on sand out there. Thus, the island green." Alice passed away at the age of \$1 on February 1, 2019, but her indelible impact on the qame lives on through the most iconic hole in golf.

Pete Dye passed shortly after Alice on January 9, 2020 at the age of 94, leaving behind an unmatched legacy in golf course design. He quite literally changed the game.

And now, more than four decades later, what started as an excavation site and a Northeast Florida swampland has turned into one of the most famous stadiums in the world.








- Doppelganger Hole One and Hole Ten are designed as mirror images of one another.




- Of the 71 total birdies for the week on Hole 3, Lucas Glover made the only chip-in birdie to go along with his 2 other chip-ins in Round 3.




- Average distance to the hole on approach for the week on Hole 4 was 22' 8".




- The average approach shot on Hole 6 stopped 19' 8" from the hole in 2025.






- Ryan Gerard hit the green all four days and holed 15 and 27 footer's for birdie to play the demanding Hole 8 two under for the week.




- Out of the 7 eagles for the week in 2025, four of them came from players holing out off the green.




- With holes 10 and 1 being mirror images of each other, the tenth played a touch easier with 17 more birdies for the week.




- There were 5 total eagles made for the week on Hole 11, including a green side bunker hole out from Jordan Speith in Round 1.

- 9.5% of the players going for the green in two landed on the surface resulting in 38 birdies and 4 eagles.












- There were 12 3 putts and 2- 4 putts on Hole 15 in 2025.






- Justin Lower holed out for par from the drop zone in the first round after his first shot found the water.

- On the 17th hole the longest putt of 53 feet 6 inches was made by Byeong Hun An in the third round.




